ARDA President Report



Hi there and welcome to another ARDA Newsletter. Carol does a wonderful job of presenting this publication and takes a lot of pride in it. Well done.

It is with pride that I introduce myself as the new ARDA President and with quite a new line up in the Executive team. Thank you to Bev McLachlan as outgoing President and to Julie Jensen as the retiring Treasurer. Bev having held office for around 14 years and Julie for around six. I wish them well in their next endeavours with Bev and Nev possibly choosing to do a bit more travel.

We welcome Anna-Lee Hodalj to the team as incoming Treasurer. It is so refreshing to see new talent come forward and that we now have a third State represented on the Executive committee. Anna-Lee has already brought enthusiasm into the role and although maybe young has a very mature head. With her help we have already started revamping the way the financials will be managed and reported at the next AGM. We welcome back Carol Simondson to the role of Secretary, Chris Heyworth as Vice President and Paula Armstrong as the Education Officer.

One of my goals is to involve more of our members in the running of the association. We are looking for volunteers onto committees we are setting up to improve the way we do things. There are a multitude of procedures covering every aspect of what we do and how we do it. If you are interested please drop a line to Carol Simondson and she will pass on the information to the correct area.

With the social distancing and limitations, we have been presenting online teaching across the Zoom platform. While this is at best second to in person teaching, it is at least giving folks the opportunity to join in and has given us the chance to provide better teaching in some areas. We were going to introduce Jive and West Coast in the Blue Mountains at the National, but time restrictions would have meant 60-90 minutes at best for either. We have been able to deliver around 15 hours on West Coast so far to those who have joined in. We are now up to our third of four weekly Jive sessions. Even if people are not physically dancing with us it has been an opportunity to engage with others by simply watching. So far we have had all States (and a few from overseas) joining us. I would personally like to thank those who have joined us.

I am also looking to further involve the ARDA State representatives in their home States. But this is not a one way street and so I ask dancers out there to actively support and contact your State rep. Be it requesting teach/dance material or putting forward suggestions for the Showcase & Experimental nominations. There has already been great work in NSW and we would love more to become involved. Representatives are Shirley Bates - SA, Helen Hodalj - NSW, Chris Heyworth - Qld, Coral Wegmann - Vic, Di Ashton - Tas, Tony McDonald - ACT, and Anthea Matthews - WA. Their contacts can be found on the ARDA website and most of them in the Square Dance Review. Let them know what is happening with your club, what you might be teaching, or anything that is connected to round Dancing.

Most of all Paula and I would like to wish all dancers the speediest returns to the activity you love in the safest way possible. We look forward to seeing you all on the dance floor again soon. I know there are some clubs who have started back and let us hope this continues.

DANCE and MUSIC RESOURCES



Over the years changes have evolved in the way we go looking for music and for educational material. The last five years have seen enormous changes. It was only a few years ago I was starting to highlight the changes in the music sources of the ROUNDALAB ROQ, with the source changing from dedicated Square & Round Dance records to Ballroom CD's and online music purchase.

Regarding the music, I am not aware of any music being produced just for Round Dancing. The days of producing the likes of Grenn, Windsor, etc are well and truly gone. While there are a couple of older Choreographers who may occasionally use an old record, new material is done to music out in the public domain – iTunes, Amazon etc. For strict tempo Ballroom music, the site of choice is Casa Musica, which is based in Germany. Some of the Classics are being re-released by the original labels and there is currently a CD available. I will need to find the details of this.

Here are some areas you may want to look at for both education and dance material.

- Follow some of the links from the Roundalab site. These are for State and National associations. A lot of these have Rounds of the month/quarter – eg Colorado, California etc
- Check out the online subscription service offered by ROUNDALAB for their videos.
- Join ICBDA – very small fee and there are some technical advantages with their TAC manual. They list the summary of popular dances and most taught in the Phase IV – VI. There is also a Top 15 dances from the last 20 Conventions. When people register for the convention they are encouraged to go online and vote for the dances they want to see on program. The Top 15 list are the most popular dances as voted by the dancers. They also have a great quarterly newsletter.
- Look to purchase the DVD's made at the ICBDA conventions. There is some fantastic material from the teach clinics conducted on the first day of each convention.
- On the home page of the ICBDA site there is a link to "We Dance". This was a site set up many years ago by Art Hayes to show dances being demonstrated. Art passed away about 5 or 6 years ago and ICBDA agreed to keep the site working. Although no new material has been added since then there is a lot of video of PH IV – VI dances dating back nearly 20 years.
- <https://www.glenhelendance.com/> is a site that has 100's of demo material. You will need to ask for a password to access the site but just tell them you were directed there by us. There is also some old footage from as early as the late 70's of some of the pioneers of our activity.
- A link from this site will also take you to a You Tube site set up by Paul Zimmer featuring dances in the PH II – III range. This also includes new footage of older dances. There is also a great trailer he has set up describing what Round Dancing is while Rey & Sherry Garza dance. This could be used to send to people who ask what Round Dancing is.
- <https://curtandtammy.com/> this site is great for learning the dances. This is a paid subscription site. Curt posts a lot of the dances he has taught through the season as teaches. For the \$99 US you can access the last three years of teaching phases IV _ VI. If this dance has been popular in the last 12 months there is a good chance he has teaching footage here. The US club season is October to March so outside this time the list will not change.
- Set up Shazam on your phone to identify tunes you hear on the radio or in stores. Great for keeping a library so you don't have to remember the names of music pieces if you are writing dances.

Every year ARDA invites each State/Territory to nominate both a Showcase and Experimental for presentation at the upcoming Australian National Square Dance Convention.

ARDA has a representative in each State/Territory to coordinate this process.

Successful nominations are added to the National Dance List after presentation.





Australian Round Dance Association

'ARDA stands committed to the ongoing education and support of its member, all round dancers and the future of round dancing.'

CRITERIA Guidelines for Showcase and Experimental Nominations and their addition to the National Round Dance List. - as per the By-Laws

- 9.4 (a)** The choice of dances that are to be presented as either a Showcase and/or Experimental will be left to the members of the State/Territory nominating the dance.
National Convention Committees may request that nominated dances are to the 'theme' of their Convention. This request will not be mandatory.
After consideration to ascertain that the requirements have been met the choice of the dance to be presented will be left to the Management Committee of the Australian Round Dance Association and/or the Australian National Square Dance Convention Committee.

Should a State/Territory recognized by the Australian National Square Dance Convention Operations Manual not present a Showcase the Management Committee of the Australian Round Dance Association may nominate a dance to fill this vacancy. It will be the responsibility of the Management Committee of the Australian Round Dance Association to organize and fulfil the necessary requirements of this Showcase/Experimental presentation.

ARDA requests, that a minimum of two (2) and maximum of three (3) nominations be submitted for the Showcase and Experimental sessions duly identified as 'First', 'Second' and third choice.

- 9.4 (b)** The State/Territory representative of ARDA shall ensure that -
- 1) the music is readily available for purchase as per 9.2 *'Modification to only the start and/or end of purchased music'* will be accepted.
 - 2) the dance has not been previously nominated as either a Showcase or Experimental dance.
 - (3) the nominated dance is danced as per the published cue sheet without modification. (This will create a problem should the published cue sheet be incorrect eg. Wrong directions, wrong footwork or wrong movement.)
 - (4) taking into consideration any adjustment eg. To the speed or modification as per (1) the length of the Showcase dance be no longer than 3.30 minutes and the Experimental (Cat B) dance be no longer than 4.00 minutes.
 - (5) the full cue sheets for all dances nominated are submitted to the ARDA Management Committee (Secretary) together with the approved Showcase and/or Experimental Proforma.
 - (6) Showcase dances are Phase III or below (Cha*, Foxtrot, Jive, Rumba* (* Phase III+1 Alemana or Aida) , Two Step, Waltz) and Experimental dances are Ph III+ to Ph IV+2 as per By-Laws 9.1.1 and 9.1.2.
 - (7) An Experimental should have at least one (1), and not more than three (3) new movements not already in a dance on the National Dance List.
- 9.4 (c)** 1) The ARDA Management Committee will advise the National Square Dance Convention Round Dance Representative (round dance programmer) of the successful nominations as quickly as possible.

If the above criteria is not adhered to, ARDA has the right to not accept the dance.

Your Committee hopes that you have a relaxing and safe holiday. We all welcome the break from routine, that comes after the 'silly season', and we trust that you will make the most of it and bounce back again next year all rested and refreshed.

SHOWCASE FOR the 35th NATIONAL.

Because we have such a short time frame between the Perth Convention and the forthcoming one in Canberra and because states are experiencing difficulties in finding enough scope to select a suitable dance to be presented as a Showcase the Management Committee has decided that FOR THIS TIME ONLY we will broaden the criteria required regarding the SHOWCASE SELECTION.

☆ The time frame will be extended.....under our present criteria it is a 12 month period ending two months prior to the forthcoming Convention. We are prepared to consider dances from a longer period (i.e. from previous years). The Management will consider such applications but reserves the right to request alternate submissions if it is felt the dance is 'too old'.

☆ Normal criteria regarding availability of the record will still hold.

☆ Phase level to the new criteria of below Roundalab Phase 3+1 (which was not due to come into force until AFTER the Canberra Convention) will also be considered, in order to give a wider selection of dances.

☆ Sources for Dances shall be as in our new Criteria. (As was agreed in Perth) i.e. ROUND DANCER Magazine top ten (which has been non existent? ? ?) AMERICAN SQUARE DANCE MAGAZINE Round Dance Pulse Poll, ROUNDALAB Round of the Quarter, CALLERLAB Round of the Quarter. If a State wishes to submit a Dance outside these sources they MAY DO SO...but must also submit full details of record number & availability, Phase level, a cue sheet, to the Management Committee who will decide if the dance is eligible to be presented or whether an alternate selection must be found.

N.B. THE MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE IS MEETING NEXT ON 30th JAN. '94 PLEASE CONTACT SANTO OR GAIL BEFORE THAT DATE IF YOU WISH HAVE A DANCE THAT REQUIRES CONSIDERATION. Besides, you need to have selected some dance by then anyway as the Convention will be looming.

(Santo is the SELECTED LEADER for the Canberra Convention. . so any showcase selection needs to come to him. . A.S.A.P.)

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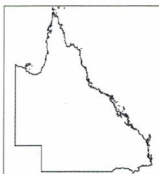
UPDATE ON APRA LICENCE FEE 2011-2012

We are also going to investigate the possibility of being a link from the Wikipedia page on Round Dancing – yes, there is one and it makes interesting reading.

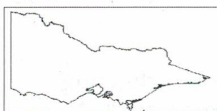


DANCERS' PERSONAL CONTRIBUTIONS.

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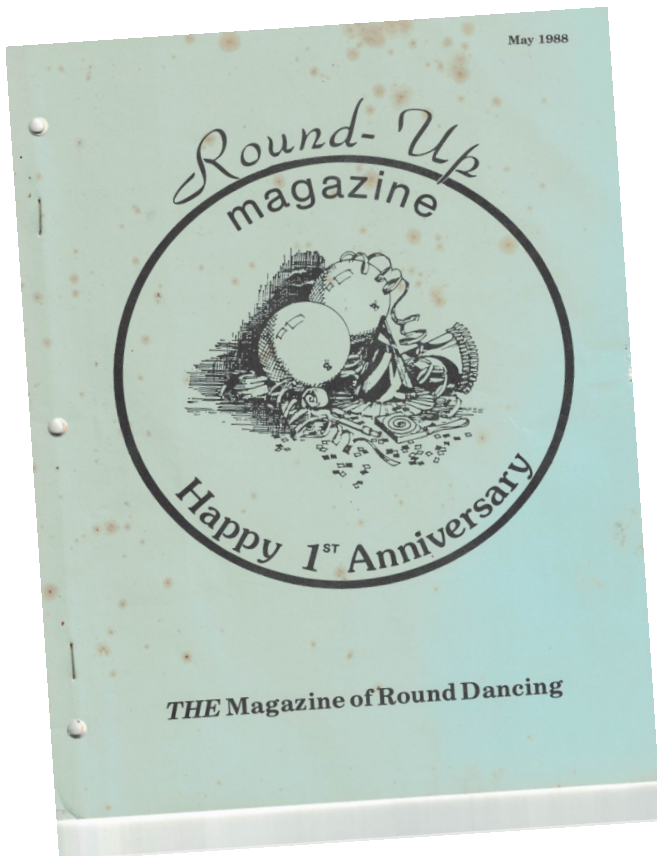

NOTES FOR CHOREOGRAPHERS

First we wish to thank each and every choreographer that has already sent or is planning to send us a cue sheet for publication. We appreciate your support.

We have been asked what level we plan to emphasize in our publication. The answer is that we hope not to emphasize any one level or levels. Cue sheets are written for all levels of rounds and we plan to publish every cue sheet we receive as long as it meets our cue sheet requirements. We hope to have a well rounded publication having all levels represented.

Speaking of cue sheet requirements..... If you have not received a copy of our requirements, please let us know and we will be glad to send you a copy.

In our requirements we request that you send us a copy of the record along with an original copy of the cue sheet or a copy suitable for printing.

If any choreographer chooses not to send us a copy of the record we will not be able to check the cue sheet for obvious errors other than typographical errors. We would rather not have to print a cue sheet error correction column. As a choreographer, you have to right to refuse to submit a copy of the record and we will respect that right. We feel however that it is a small price to pay for advertising both you and your round dance.

Remember too that we will be glad to act as a clearing house for "pop" rounds. Simply call or write to us and we will record the record number, your name, your phone number, record title and artist. We then give you the first chance at publication (the round must be received at our office within 45 days).

If you have any questions, please write to us (our address is on page 1) and we will be glad to answer your questions.

We would like to request that choreographers write the release date of the dance on the cue sheet so that everyone will know when it was released.

One last note. If your round is to a square or round dance record, it is our policy that we will not publish that cue sheet until we have received permission to print from the owner of that label. If you want to write a round to a square or round dance record, please contact that label first and obtain permission. They will work with you and everyone wins.

It is with much sadness that we have decided to close VALENTINE ROUNDS round dance club.

We first started square dancing in 1984 where we had our first taste of round dancing when we learnt Fraulein taught by Warwick Armstrong.

From then on we were sold on round dancing and started learning in earnest in 1986 with Elva Hoppe and then with Allemander Rounds. In 1994 we started cueing and teaching round dancing at Gumdale.

We started our own club on Valentine's Day 14 February 2001 hence our club name, and we danced at Camp Hill School of Arts hall for nine years.
